EDISTLE

ROMANS 8:1-11

Hence, now there is no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus. For the law of the spirit of life in Christ Jesus has freed you from the law of sin and death. For what the law, weakened by the flesh, was powerless to do, this God has done: by sending his own Son in the likeness of sinful flesh and for the sake of sin, he condemned sin in the flesh, so that the righteous decree of the law might be fulfilled in us, who live not according to the flesh but according to the spirit. For those who live according to the flesh are concerned with the things of the flesh, but those who live according to the spirit with the things of the spirit. The concern of the flesh is death, but the concern of the spirit is life and peace. For the concern of the flesh is hostility toward God; it does not submit to the law of God, nor can it; and those who are in the flesh cannot please God. But you are not in the flesh; on the contrary, you are in the spirit, if only the Spirit of God dwells in you. Whoever does not have the Spirit of Christ does not belong to him. But if Christ is in you, although the body is dead because of sin, the spirit is alive because of righteousness. If the Spirit of the one who raised Jesus from the dead dwells in you, the one who raised Christ from the dead will give life to your mortal bodies also, through his Spirit that dwells in you. XXX

The Massabki Brothers, continued from page 1

On July 9th, 1860 a fire broke out through the Christian area of Damascus. Many Maronite families, including the three Massabki brothers, took refuge in a Franciscan monastery. While everyone took refuge on the roof, Francis remained kneeling at the feet of the Sorrowful Mother. Moments later the church was attacked. The invaders noticed Francis kneeling in prayer. They recognized him and told him that the Sheikh had sent them to save him and his family from death, on the condition that he deny his faith and convert. Francis answered them, "Sheikh Abdullah can take my money, he can also take my life; but my faith no one can make me deny. I am a Christian and in the faith of Christ, I will die." Francis was then put to death.

The attackers then confronted Abdel El –Maoti in the convent yard and also asked him to renounce his faith to escape death; He refused and was also martyred. They found Raphael inside the convent and he was offered the same choice as his brothers, but he also refused and was martyred.

On October 7, 1926, His Holiness Pius XI proclaimed the



My Dear Friends:

Fr. Tom Boyer, a retired bi-ritual (Maronite and Roman) priest in Naples, Florida, writes for several bulletins. He has begun a series looking deeper into Maronite spirituality, which I will be sharing with you. Here is his first reflection.

This week following the Feast of Saints Peter and Paul, I am taking a little initiative to draw you deeper in the Spirituality of the East where our Maronite roots have both nourished and been nourished by a form of prayer in paint rather than in words. An "Icon" is a prayer. It is a hymn of praise in color and harmony. It is a work of beauty inspired by God, often adorning the Church and drawing into the mysteries we celebrate and into a relationship with saints often appearing in icons. An Icon can speak to the heart and soul, and it is a window into heaven lifting us up to Christ and the Saints.

Last week, Saints Peter and Paul were the focus of our celebration. I put before you today a Maronite Icon [to the left, at the bottom of page 2.] Pray with it through the coming weeks. See our Lord standing in the center with Peter holding keys standing on a rock. See Saint Paul holding the Book of his Letters and the sword, a symbol of his martyrdom. Christ holds a scroll in his left hand and his right hand is raised in blessing. Two pillars and an arch frame this Icon reminding us that Peter and Paul are the pillars of the church.

In the background is the world into which these apostles were commissioned by Our Lord to go and preach the Gospel and baptize the nations. Behind St. Peter are the hills of Antioch with the snow-capped mountains of Lebanon. Behind Paul lies a rocky terrain and the sea of his journeys. The shape of a church draws them all together with windows that look out into the world. Across the bottom in Greek is the great commission "Go into the whole world and preach the Gospel to all creation." It is a mandate given to us as well, and the best preaching is often not done with words, but by action and service.

Fr. Tom is absolutely correct: we preach best with joy and smiles and service. I pray that you all will have a blessed week.
