#### **EDISTLE**

1 THESSALONIANS 5:1-11

Concerning times and seasons, brothers, you have no need for anything to be written to you. For you yourselves know very well that the day of the Lord will come like a thief at night. When people are saying, "Peace and security," then sudden disaster comes upon them, like labor pains upon a pregnant woman, and they will not escape. But you, brothers, are not in darkness, for that day to overtake you like a thief. For all of you are children of the light and children of the day. We are not of the night or of darkness. Therefore, let us not sleep as the rest do, but let us stay alert and sober. Those who sleep go to sleep at night, and those who are drunk get drunk at night. But since we are of the day, let us be sober, putting on the breastplate of faith and love and the helmet that is hope for salvation. For God did not destine us for wrath, but to gain salvation through our Lord Jesus Christ, who died for us, so that whether we are awake or asleep we may live together with him. Therefore, encourage one another and build one another up, as indeed you do.

#### MORE FROM ITALY!

Sub Deacon Mike and his wife Lisa traveled in Italy. Here is some more commentary on the churches they visited..



(top left) The tomb of St. Carlo Acutis in St Mary Maggiore Church. St. Carlo was born in Milan and was very devoted to St. Francis. He died of Leukemia in 2006 at the age of 15, was beatified by Pope Francis in Assisi in 2020, and was canonized by Pope Leo last month.

Deacon Mike and Lisa at the Basilica of St. Francis of Assisi. The Basilica is built on top of the old church. Both churches are still in use and St. Francis is entombed in the basement. The frescoes in the Basilica follow the life of St. Francis as written in a biography by St. Bonaventure. Assisi is home to less than 1000 full time residents and survives on tourism and weekend residents.



## The Pastor's Corner

SHORT ARTICLES AND NOTES

#### My Dear Friends:

The Acts of the Apostles, chapter 8 shows how the Gospel begins to spread beyond Jerusalem after the persecution that followed Stephen's martyrdom. Philip preaches in Samaria and many believe and are baptized: "Thus Philip went down to the city of Samaria and proclaimed the Messiah to them" (8:5). Peter and John came to lay hands on the new believers, and they receive the Holy Spirit: "Now when the apostles in Jerusalem heard that Samaria had accepted the word of God, they sent them Peter and John, who went down and prayed for them, that they might receive the Holy Spirit" (8:14-15). We also hear of Simon the magician who tries to buy the power of the Spirit. He said: "Give me this power too, so that anyone upon whom I lay my hands may receive the Holy Spirit. But Peter said to him, may your money perish with you, because you thought that you could buy the gift of God with money" (8:19-20). Finally Philip is led by the Spirit to meet an Ethiopian official reading Isaiah; he explains the Scriptures, he announces Jesus, and he baptizes him. "Then he ordered the chariot to stop, and Philip and the eunuch both went down into the water, and he baptized him" (8:38).

This chapter highlights that the Gospel breaks barriers of culture, nation, and background, calling all to faith in our Lord Jesus Christ.

#### THE MINOR PROPHETS: HABAKKUK

The prophet Habakkuk lived around the end of the 7th century B.C., during a time of violence and injustice in Judah. Habakkuk speaks to God more than to the people, asking difficult questions: "How long, O Lord? I cry for help but you do not listen!" (1:2). God answers by assuring him that the wicked will not last, but "The just man, because of his faith, shall live" (2:4). In the end, Habakkuk proclaims trust and joy in God, saying: "Yet will I rejoice in the Lord, and exult in my saving God" (3:18).

His message reminds us to remain faithful and hopeful, even when life feels uncertain.


